To develop and deliver an exciting, engaging and inclusive programme of activities within the dance & performing arts studio which will engage young people aged 8 – 19 years (up to 25 for young people with SEND) at Wigan Youth Zone.

To support and work with our existing members to develop a specific street or commercial Dance team.

To utilise dance and performance in the wider youth work agenda, supporting and encouraging young people to express themselves, explore issues and facilitate personal development.

WHAT YOU WILL BE DOING

- To support the Dance co-ordinator in the development and delivery of Dance activities at Wigan Youth Zone with a focus on Street Dance.
- To become part of a forward thinking, innovative and motivated dance team and assist with the delivery of all aspects of Dance sessions with young people.
- To work well in a team bringing fresh skills & ideas to the current offer.
- To motivate, encourage and support young people to try Dance activities and participate fully in sessions.
- To break down any barriers to young people participating in the Dance programme of activities; To become part of sessional staffing requirements for the Dance department.
- To support volunteers in sessions, coaching them to achieve their full potential within their given roles
- To deal with any problems that arise during Youth Zone sessions;
- Develop and maintain a professional relationship with the young people who attend the Dance Studio.
- Understand the needs of Wigan Youth Zone and communicate them in a clear, consistent way to the young people, parents and guardians.
- Prepare and deliver sessions that meet with Wigan youth zone rules and regulations.
- Work within the performance framework of Wigan Youth Zone and OnSide;
- Represent Wigan Youth Zone positively and effectively in all dealings with internal colleagues, and external partners;
- To be alert to issues of safeguarding and child protection, ensuring the welfare and safety of Youth Zone members is promoted and safeguarded, and to report any child protection concerns to the designated Child Protection Officers using the safeguarding policies, procedures and practice (training to be provided);
- To assist with any promotional activities and visits that take place at the Youth Zone;
- To actively promote the Youth Zone and positively contribute towards increasing Youth Zone membership;
- To adhere to Wigan Youth Zone policies at all times, with particular reference to Health and Safety, Safeguarding and Equal Opportunities.



SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- A willingness to work unsociable hours when required
- DBS clearance and committed to Safeguarding children
- The ability and willingness to travel to meetings and events both in the region and beyond
- The job holder will be required to adhere to the Youth Zone's policies at all times, with particular emphasis on Equal Opportunities and Safeguarding. Attendance at events and conferences will sometimes be required.

In accordance with our Child Protection and Safeguarding procedures, this position requires an enhanced DBS check and business satisfactory references.

Please note that in line with our Safeguarding Policy, you must be age 21 or over to work in our Senior Sessions and 19+ to work on our Junior Sessions and Holiday Clubs. All applicants must also be inactive as members for at least 12 months.

WHAT IS WIGAN YOUTH ZONE?

Wigan Youth Zone is a purpose built, state-of-the-art youth facility in Wigan town centre which opened in June 2013. It offers young people from across Wigan the opportunity to meet friends, have new experiences, learn new skills and access the support they need to develop and achieve their potential.

The Youth Zone is open to all young people across Wigan aged from 8 to 19 (up to 25 with additional needs), striving to offer something for everyone, regardless of their interests or abilities. With almost 15 dedicated areas to choose from including our four 40-metre floodlit football pitches, art room, music room and climbing wall – there's something for everyone here at Wigan Youth Zone.

Our aim is simple, to provide the town's young people with somewhere to go, something to do and someone to talk to.
